

Where your money will go

■ Wastewater treatment plant

Delayed for up to three years, but to be built as soon as environmentally and financially affordable.

■ Sarjeant Gallery

\$4 million from the earthquake-strengthening rate over three years, from 2017-18, as

Council makes its call on 10-year plan

part of the \$31.5 million redevelopment project.

■ Council buildings

Quake-strengthening to at least the minimum standard of 34 per cent of the National Building Standard in 2015-16 and 2016-17

■ Wanganui East Pool

Staged refurbishment at \$75,000 per year over five years — a less expensive option than redeveloping the complex or the construction of a new outdoor pool.

■ Pensioner housing

Commitment that such housing does not require ratepayer funding; engage with a community working group to review best use of the portfolio and/or proceeds of the sale or partial sale.

■ Forestry

Sell joint venture forests (excluding Nukumarū and Waitahinga) and proceeds used to repay debt.

■ New venture

Council-controlled trading organisation set up to run a new aviation business at airport.
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
